19 new faces for independent MACC panels

PUTRAJAYA: Nineteen new faces have been appointed to the three independent panels that come under the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC).

They were among 26 people who were given letters of appointment by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak here yesterday declaring them as members of either the Operations Review Panel (eight members), the Consultation and Corruption Prevention Panel (14 members), and the Complaints Committee (four members)

The duration of appointments to the Operations Review Panel and Complaints Committee is for two years, while it was only for a year for those sitting on the Consultation and Corruption Prevention Panel.

Among those on the Operations Review Panel are New Straits Times Press (M) Bhd chairman Tan Sri Mohamed Jawhar Hassan, Bank Islam (M) Bhd chairman Datuk Zamani Abdul Ghani Universiti Sains Malaysia Criminology Faculty Assoc Professor Dr P. Sundramoorthy, and former Bar Council president Lim Chee Wee.
