PUTRAJAYA: Prime Minister Datuk Sen Najib Tun Razak had a four-eyed meeting with his British counterpart David Cameron at Perdana Putra here yesterday.

The two leaders held the talk before heading for a delegation meeting.

Cameron's one-day visit to Malaysia was part of a four-leg tour of the region which included Indonesia, Singapore and Vietnam. The aim was to boost Britain's trade and investment.

Cameron is the first British Prime Minister to visit Malaysia in two successive terms, having previously visited in April 2012.

Wisma Putra said Cameron's visit manifested the close and cordial ties between Malaysia

and Britain.

"Both leaders took stock of bilateral relations including in the areas of trade and investment, education and defence as well as cooperation within the framework of the Commonwealth and the United Nations," it said in a statement.

During his Southeast Asia visit, Cameron was accompanied by 31 business representatives from Britain and Secretary of State for Business, Innovation and Skills Sajid Javid, Minister of State for Trade and Investment Lord Francis Maude, Minister for Small Business, Industry and Enterprise Anna Soubry and Minister of State for Defence Procurement Philip Dunne.
