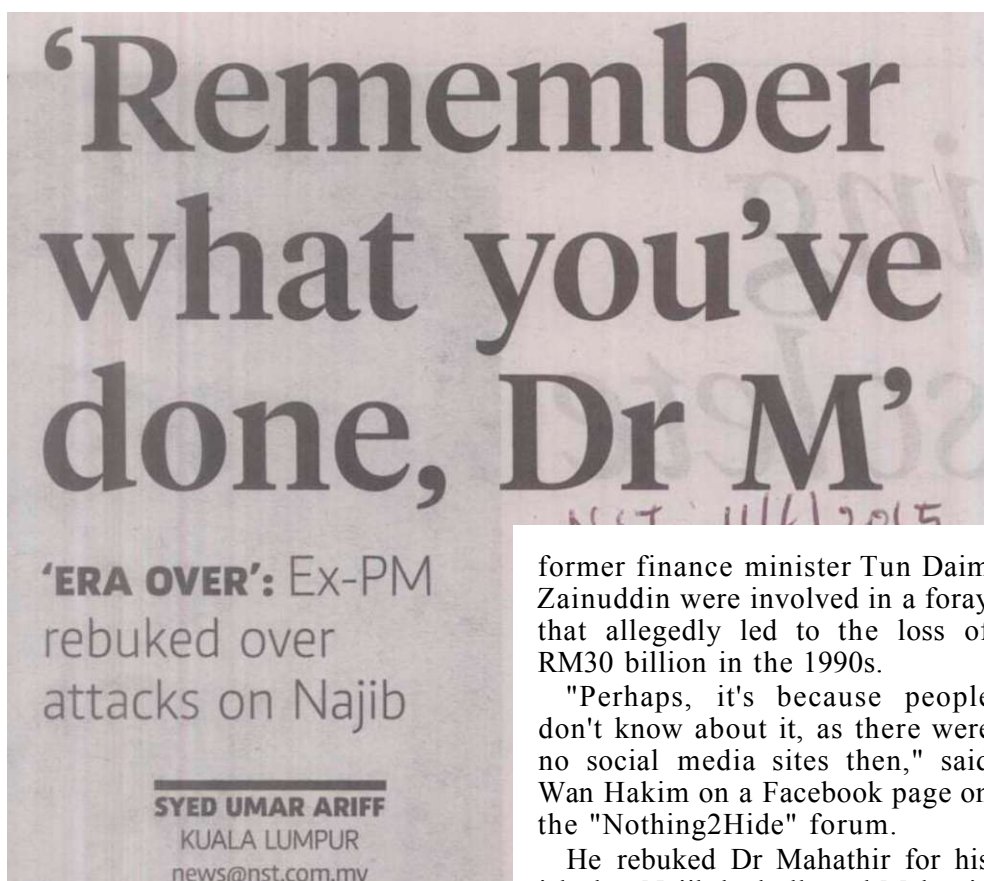

TERENGGANU Umno information chief Wan Abdul Hakim Mokhtar yesterday reminded Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad of what he did when he led the country as prime minister for more than two decades.

He said allegations by Dr Mahathir to implicate Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak in the purported loss of billions of ringgit did not come close to what had been done by the former prime minister.

He claimed that Dr Mahathir and

former finance minister Tun Daim Zainuddin were involved in a foray that allegedly led to the loss of RM30 billion in the 1990s.

"Perhaps, it's because people don't know about it, as there were no social media sites then," said Wan Hakim on a Facebook page on the "Nothing2Hide" forum.

He rebuked Dr Mahathir for his jab that Najib had allowed Malaysia to be "recolonised" through ties with Singapore and the United States.

"He (Dr Mahathir) should know that the era of cowboy diplomacy is over. Has old age affected his ability to think rationally? Whatever it is, he should pause. Perhaps, God will give him guidance.

"Dr M is no longer prime minister. Just as Umno members had to abide by the decisions he made when he was president, now, he must abide by those of the current president (Najib)."
