PRIME Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak said yesterday he was disappointed that Mara chairman Tan Sri Annuar Musa's statement on the property purchase in Melbourne was twisted by some media.

"The decision was undertaken in a consensus manner by the Economic Council.

"However, investigations will be conducted by the authorities," he said in his Facebook posting yesterday evening.

He gave his assurances that if

there were any quarters found to have cheated or misled members of the Economic Council with inaccurate or incomplete details, legal action would be taken against those who were responsible.

In another posting earlier, Najib expressed sadness over the case of a boy in Banting, who suffered serious injuries while playing with firecrackers.

"News like this saddens me. Children getting injured as a result of playing with firecrackers. I pray that Allah will lighten their suffering, protect them," he wrote.

On Monday, 4-year-old Mohd Azman Syakir Mohd Saizi suffered serious injuries to his left hand and burns to his chest while playing with a type of firecracker known as "A-Boom" in Taman Mutiara in Tanjung Sepat, Banting, Selangor.

The boy is receiving treatment at Tengku Ampuan Rahimah Hospital in Klang.
