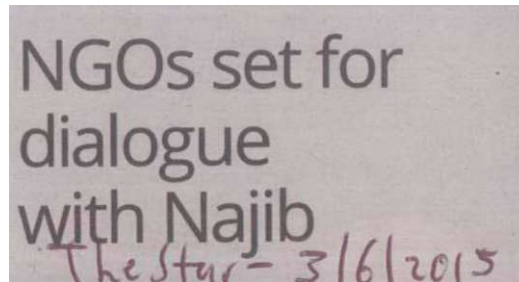

KUALA LUMPUR: More than 1,000 representatives from non-governmental organisations nationwide will have the opportunity to have an interactive dialogue with the Prime Minister on various issues, including the Malaysia Development Berhad (MDB) in a dialogue.
