On the fifth implication, Kadir said: "If the court agrees to hear this case, the plaintiffs can attempt to summon as many witnesses as possible, including foreign journalists who had made claims of corruption by Najib."

The plaintiffs' lawyer, Mohd Khatri Abdulla, yesterday told *Malaysiakini* that Najib's wife Rosmah Mansor may be subpoenaed as a **witness** in relation to the legal suit.

Mohd Khatri also said he intends to subpoena Communications and Multimedia Minister Salleh Said Keruak as well as Deputy Home Minister Nur Jazlan Mohamed.

### Propaganda machine

At the same time, Kadir claimed that Najib's cyber warfare and propaganda machine are unlikely to be able to manipulate facts in the legal suit.

This, he claimed, was because they were currently too busy "fighting among themselves to prove who is the most loyal and who were the 'wolves in sheep's clothing'".

"This suit can also be seen in the context of the Citizens' Declaration calling for Najib's removal as prime minister.

"The three plaintiffs are all signatories of the declaration signed on March 4," said Kadir.

Mahathir, together with former Batu Kawan Umno division vice-chairperson Khairuddin Abu Hassan and former Langkawi Wanita Umno member Anina Saadudin, had filed the case at Kuala Lumpur High Court for alleged breach of fiduciary duty and misfeasance in public office.

Misfeasance is a legal term referring to actions that are legal but performed improperly.
