# PM: Beware of opposition's 'politics of illusion'

**KUALA LUMPUR:** The people must not be fooled or believe in the opposition's "politics of illusion" as it could lead to disappointment, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak.

He said the people would be disappointed with the opposition's negative propaganda as its main job was to instigate them.

"Yesterday (Saturday), I showed a video of Rafizi (Ramli) saying that it was the job of the opposition to instigate and incite.

"The opposition knows that if you cannot convince people, let's confuse them," he said when opening

the Peace, Progress and Prosperity (myPPP) party's 63rd General Assembly here yesterday.

Present were myPPP president Tan Sri M. Kayveas, Barisan Nasional secretary-general Datuk Seri Tengku Adnan Tengku Mansor, myPPP senior vice-president Datuk Seri Maglin Dennis D'Cruz and vice-president Datuk Dr Loga Bala Mohan.

Najib, who is BN chairman, said the opposition should present its plan if it did not agree with the BN-led government.

"However, they cannot even decide who should be the prime min-

ister. They are dysfunctional, they do not trust each other, they do not even like each other."

He said the government did not run the country on the politics of expediency, but on principles and morality.

On MyPPP, he said, the BN component party had shown that it was a progressive party which could move forward, despite its relatively small size.

He said the party under the leadership of Kayveas had also proven to be a committed and loyal member of the coalition.

"The party has launched pro-

grammes and initiatives for the benefit of the people, in line with the government's effort to transform Malaysia."

Najib said BN must show that it was the agent of transformation and change itself.

Under his leadership, Najib said changes could be done without the need to change the ruling party.

Kayveas said myPPP had launched 1,725 social transformation programmes for the past year, including English language lessons for youth, insurance coverage for members and assistance for single mothers.
