PM: Help Sarawak BN to win election

'SOLIDARITY': Najib calls on all quarters to show support for Adenan

PRIME Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak has called for the support of all quarters, from the Barisan Nasional leadership to the grassroots, to ensure victory in the Sarawak election.

"Soon, we will face the Sarawak election. I want all quarters, from the top leadership to the grassroots, to stay united and put the people's interest above their own.

"Do not let ambitions and personal interests get in the way of Barisan Nasional's success and its efforts to champion the rights of the people of Bumi Kenyalang," he wrote in his blog last night.

"Let us close ranks, strengthen

solidarity and ensure that Sarawak remains under BN's rule."

During his two-day visit to Sarawak, he said BN's leadership in Sarawak under Chief Minister Tan Sri Adenan Satem was well received by the people.

"Tan Sri (Adenan) is a leader with a deep understanding of the needs of the local communities.

"He is a leader who does not hesitate to voice his opinions and thoughts for the sake of the people, and Sarawak and federal governments.

"God's willing, no ocean can separate our kinship and mutual understanding under the umbrella of BN."

He said both parties would plan and develop Sarawak so that the state would continue to prosper.

"Whether the people are in rural or urban areas, nobody will be left out under my administration. This is my commitment to Tan Sri (Adenan) and the people of Sarawak," Najib said.

He said people-centric projects in

the state — such as the Pan Borneo highway, Batang Sadong bridge and the improvement of infrastructures, particularly dilapidated education institutions — had started and would continue to be rolled out to ensure the state flourished hand in hand with the country's modernisation.

Najib said the Federal Government would stimulate growth in Sarawak so that its progress was in tandem with that of the peninsula's.

He said talks on several issues, such the delegation of power, also took place in a manner that was positive and encouraging.

"This process, although time consuming, is necessary for the future of Sarawak and its people."

Najib said Sarawak had potential to soar to great heights.

"I believe that we have the perfect combination of natural resources, manpower, people's willpower and a high-calibre leadership that will allow Sarawak to realise its full potential."
