# Share terror info with us, police tell Australia

**COOPERATION:** IGP's call comes following Canberra's travel advisory

**P**OLICE yesterday urged their Australian counterparts to share any information regarding terror threats in Malaysia. The call came following a travel advisory issued by Canberra on Sunday, advising its citizens that terrorists might be planning attacks here.

Inspector-General of Police (IGP) Tan Sri Khalid Abu Bakar said he was puzzled as to what had led Australia to issue the advisory.

"We (police) do not know on what basis had Australia issued the advisory. We feel disappointed because if they (Australia) have information on terror activities in our country, they should share it.

"It has been our practice to share information and security status, especially on terror activities, with them," he said at Pavilion in Bukit Bintang here yesterday.

Khalid and Armed Forces chief General Tan Sri Zulkifeli Mohd Zin said this after accompanying Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak to a National Blue Ocean Strategy (NBOS) joint patrol.

The travel alert had advised Australians to reconsider travelling to the east coast of Sabah.

Khalid said police were aware of security threats in eastern Sabah and would take measures to prevent untoward incidents.

Zulkifeli said Najib had expressed his satisfaction with the security in the city.

He said the armed forces and police would continue with joint efforts to increase people's confidence in the country's security.

Under the NBOS initiative, the armed forces and police would deploy about 150 personnel daily to patrol strategic locations in the Klang Valley.

Among the areas are Bukit Bintang, Kuala Lumpur International Airport and shopping complexes in Subang Jaya.

Najib spent more than an hour inspecting the joint-patrol team and held discussions with local community leaders.

Present were Defence Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Hussein, Deputy Defence Minister Datuk Mohd Johari Baharum, Deputy Home Minister Masir Kujat, army chief General Tan Sri Raja Mohamed Affandi Raja Mohamed Noor and Deputy IGP Datuk Seri Noor Rashid Ibrahim.
