# Dr M told off

**REPLY:** He should watch what he says, says Zahid

## KUALA KANGSAR

**T**UN Dr Mahathir Mohamad should “watch what he says” before people start accusing him of being senile, Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi said.

“I think he should watch what he says, or people will think that he is senile. That is all I want to say,” he

said at the police tactical centre here yesterday.

Present were Menteri Besar and Perak Barisan Nasional chairman Datuk Seri Dr Zambry Abd Kadir and state police chief Datuk Seri Abdul Rahim Hanafi.

Zahid was commenting on Dr Mahathir’s statement here early yesterday that the deputy prime minister should focus on business instead of getting involved in politics.

On PKR secretary-general Rafizi Ramli’s continuous attacks on the prime minister’s wife, Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor, here, Zahid said it would not affect the BN campaign.

He said Rafizi had apologised to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak for making baseless accusations, and that reflected the truth of his statements.

Zahid, who is also home minister, said the Kuala Kangsar and Sungai Besar parliamentary by-elections were the most peaceful in history.

He said only 11 police reports had been lodged in Kuala Kangsar, and five investigation papers had been opened.

“The peaceful environment is mainly because of political maturity,” he said, adding that the election machineries of the contesting parties had not provoked each other.
