# 'Probe false signatures claim'

**BUKIT MERTAJAM:** Skuad Keadilan Pulau Pinang yesterday urged police to conduct an investigation into the alleged false signatures contained in the Mahathir-Kit Siang declaration.

Its chief, Mohd Edy Jab, said the declaration suggested elements of cheating and "that would be extremely embarrassing".

"Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad and the (Save Malaysia) secretariat admitted to the existence of up to 300,000 false signatures.

"How do they expect to save the country when they can't even be

truthful in regard to the signatures?" said Edy, who had lodged a police report on the matter at the Bukit Tengah police station at noon yesterday.

Also present were state PKR Youth chief Asrol Sani Abdul Razak and members of Skuad Keadilan Pulau Pinang.

Last month, independent computer programmer Azharuddin Othman claimed that he sold a voter database to a third party for the Mahathir-Kit Siang declaration.

In a statutory declaration,

Azharuddin had said that he had sold the details to a woman, known by the moniker Ratu Naga. The woman has denied the claims.

Meanwhile, Makkal Sakti has urged the opposition to accept the fact that the Save Malaysia campaign, formed together with Dr Mahathir, had failed.

Its president, Datuk R.S. Tanenthiran, said the opposition's defeat in the by-elections in Kuala Kangsar and Sungai Besar showed that the people were not convinced by the collaboration.
