Report lodged over Dr M's false claims

'MISCHIEVOUS': He is attempting to involve rulers in partisan politics, says MACC adviser

TUNKU Abdul Aziz Tunku Ibrahim yesterday lodged a report against former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad over the latter's claims that the king and other rulers have been placed under house arrest.

The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission adviser said the allegations were "false and mischievous", and urged the police to take action against Dr Mahathir.

He said Dr Mahathir's claims had caused public disaffection and anger against an elected government, which could threaten public security and order.

"Dr Mahathir has gone too far, far beyond the bounds of propriety."

Tunku Aziz said Dr Mahathir had attempted to involve the rulers in "partisan politics".

Dr Mahathir had reportedly claimed that
