'PPBM entirely responsible for incident'

KUALA LUMPUR: Parti Pribumi Bersatu Malaysia (PPBM) only has itself to blame for the chaos that occurred during the Nothing to Hide 2.0 forum, said the prime minister's press secretary, Datuk Seri Tengku Sariffuddin Tengku Ahmad.

Tengku Sariffuddin said PPBM was entirely responsible for the incident, as the forum was organised by the party and attended by its leadership and supporters.

"To blame Umno for the chaos clearly shows that the opposition is trying to cover up the shameless action of its own members."

Tengku Sariffuddin said the incident occurred after PPBM supporters got upset with its chairman Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad's inability to answer questions on scandals, including the jailing of Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim and the Memali incident.

"Therefore, from Nothing to Hide 2.0, the forum has become an 'Everything to hide' forum.

"As everyone knows, and as it became clear at the event, Pakatan Harapan is fundamentally divided. What else may be expected from a coalition cobbled together by a marriage of

convenience among former enemies, who did everything to destroy each other for decades?"

Tengku Sariffuddin also said the wild allegations against Umno and Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak by the Selangor menteri besar and other opposition leaders were false, reckless and unbecoming.

"It is a clear attempt to divert attention from the disintegration of PPBM, and yet another example of the opposition's reliance on creating hate and anger against the government.

"If Pakatan is unable to even organise its own forums without chaos, we can only imagine what they will do to Malaysia. It is clear that this will be a disaster for the country if the DAP-led opposition assumes power after the 14th General Election."

Tengku Sariffuddin said the respective authorities should investigate the incident and take action as provided under the law.

"This government, under the leadership of the prime minister, will continue to focus on the economic welfare, social wellbeing and security of all Malaysians."
