

Najib to give statement to cops over alleged defamatory post against Nga

KUALA LUMPUR: Datuk Seri Najib Razak has been called to assist in an investigation into his alleged defamatory statements against Dewan Rakyat Deputy Speaker Nga Kor Ming.

Bukit Aman Criminal Investigation Department's Prosecution and Legal Division principal assistant director SAC Mior Faridalattrash Wahid said the former prime minister had agreed to give his statement on the case.

"Besides Najib, Nga will also be called in for the second time to have his statement recorded at any time," he said after attending the monthly assembly at the Bukit Aman federal police headquarters here yesterday.

Nga was called up for the first time by the police on Tuesday. In connection with a Facebook post that allegedly insulted the Sultan of Selangor.

Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah.

Nga had urged the police to take action against Najib over his alleged defamatory statement against the Teluk Intan MP on his Facebook page on Sept 30.

Najib, through the posting, had called on the Pakatan Harapan government to take action against Nga, who is also Perak

DAP chairman, over an alleged seditious statement against the Sultan of Selangor.

On Sept 29, a statement insulting the Sultan of Selangor was allegedly made via the Facebook account, under the name "Nga Kor Ming Super Fans Page", allegedly urging the Chinese to protest

against the sultan, who had decreed that bilingual road signs in Selangor be removed.

Nga denied that he and the DAP were involved and claimed it was a fake account. **Bernama**
