Bersatu polls also see rise of 3 new vice-presidents

P RIME Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin has retained his post as the Parti Pribumi Bersatu Malaysia president uncontested for the 2019-2022 term.

In the same party polls, Perak Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Ahmad Faizal Azumu became the Bersatu deputy president.

Faizal's victory, although uncontested, filled the void left by Datuk Seri Mukhriz Mahathir, whose membership was terminated along with his father's, Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, and a few others for failing to toe the party line.

The election saw the rise of three new vice-presidents: Agriculture and Food Industries Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee, Senior Education Minister Dr Radzi Jidin and Paya Rumpit assemblyman Datuk Mohd Rafiq Naizamohideen.

The polls elected Kedah Bersatu chief Senator Datuk Mohd Suhaimi Abdullah as the party's permanent chairman.

chairman Tan Sri Syed Hamid Albar said the outcome was based on the Supreme Council election results on Saturday.

Syed Hamid said the polls saw 23,438 delegates voting at Bersatu's annual conference in 177 divisions nationwide, which were held simultaneously for the first time.

"From the 179 divisions, 177 divisions held their meetings, while two divisions failed to convene meetings due to a lack of quorum."

The polls elected 20 members of its Supreme Council. Among them were Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Economy) Datuk Seri Mustapa Mo-

hamed, Deputy Defence Minister Datuk Seri Ikmal Hisham Abdul Aziz, Deputy Works Minister Datuk Eddin Syazlee Shith and Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Parliament and Law), Datuk Shabudin Yahaya.

Meanwhile, Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Special Functions) Datuk Seri Mohd Redzuan Md Yusof failed to wrest one of the three vice-president's posts.

Also losing in their bid for the vice-presidency were Electoral Reform Committee chairman Tan Sri Ab Rashid Ab Rahman and Selat Kelang assemblyman Datuk Abdul Rashid Asari.
