

PM visits flood victims

Muhyiddin assures Pahang folk that govt aid will continue

TEMERLOH: Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin's visit to evacuation centres here brought out smiles and some relief to the victims, who have had to deal with having their homes hit by major floods in the past week.

During the visit, the Prime Minister chatted with the flood victims and handed out food kits.

As he listened to their grievances, he gave the evacuees some advice to keep their spirits up and assured them that the government would continue to help them cope with the aftermath of the floods.

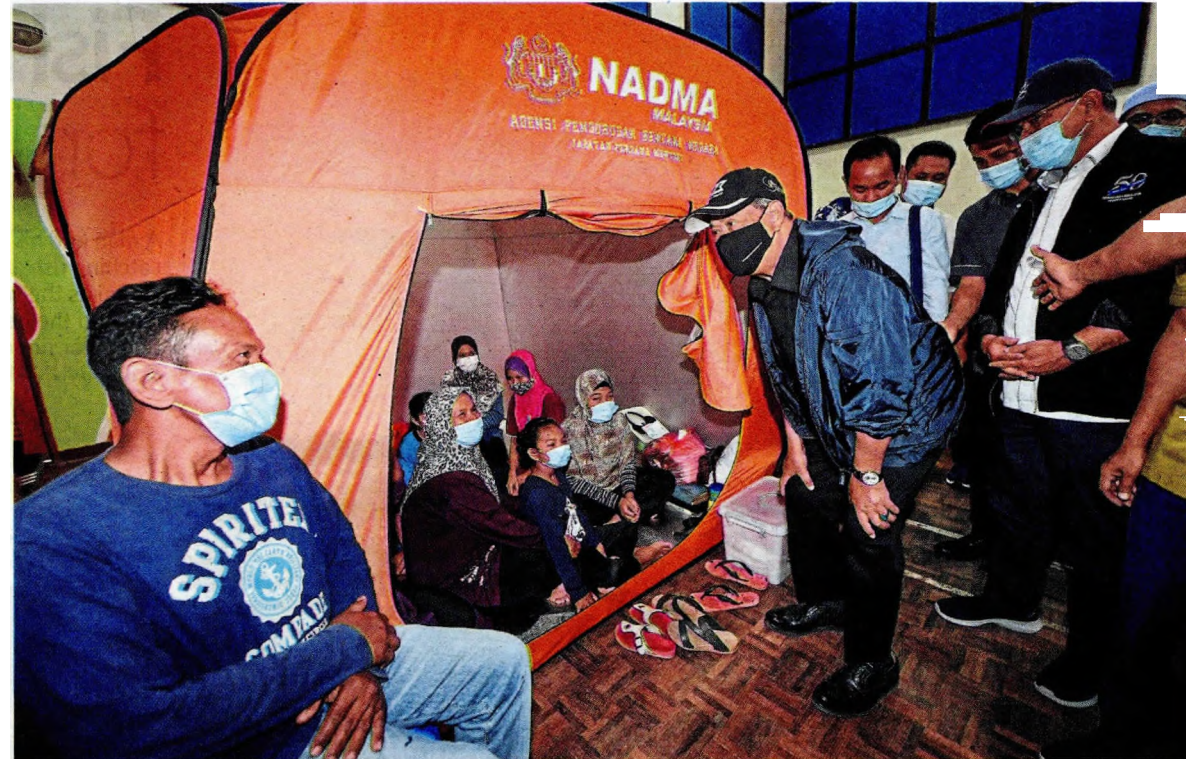
He visited two relief centres in Pahang yesterday, namely SMK Seberang Temerloh here and SM Tengku Ampuan Afzan in Maran.

Muhyiddin, who arrived in a helicopter at SMK Seberang Temerloh at 10am, was welcomed by Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Wan Rosdy Wan Ismail and spent about 40 minutes with the evacuees.

He was also briefed on flood management operations in the two districts he visited. Also present was National Disaster Management Agency (Nadma) director-general Datuk Dr Aminuddin Hassim.

Muhyiddin also surveyed the facilities provided at the SMK Seberang Temerloh relief centre, which housed 873 flood victims from 204 families as of noon yesterday.

During his visit to the SM Tengku Ampuan Afzan relief centre, which

has 173 people from 53 families, Muhyiddin was also briefed on the flood situation in the district.

He spent some time with the evacuees, who told him of their

struggle as a result of the floods.

As of noon yesterday, 40 relief centres were operating in Maran district, housing 3,605 victims from 1,134 families. — Bernama
