PM: London Move far-fetched

KUALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said the “London Move” to topple the unity government was too “far-fetched”.

When asked by reporters to comment on rumours of such efforts, Anwar said the move should be conducted in the country instead.

“London Move is too far. It would be cheaper if a ‘Kajang Move’ was done instead,” he said before Friday prayers in Bukit Aman here.

Anwar was responding to several pictures of Perikatan Nasional chairman Tan Sri

Muhyiddin Yassin holding a closed-door meeting in London which were circulating online.

The pictures fuelled speculation on plans hatched by certain parties to oust Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, who is also the deputy prime minister.

Umno vice-president Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob also claimed he had fallen victim to a “slandorous attack” by being linked to the alleged plan.

The former prime minister said he was not in London, but had been on a vacation to the Middle East with his family.
