



PM fulfilling his promises but more needs to be done

THE determination of Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim to realise the transformation that has long been emphasised is seen as a success in fulfilling his promises, especially regarding corruption.

According to the G25 group of eminent Malays and retired civil servants co-founder, Tan Sri Mohd Sheriff Mohd Kassim, the achievement of the 100 days of the unity government can also be seen in the

governance of its administration.

He says Anwar's commitment to streamlining the administration will be able to restore the stability of the government structure by making it more systematic and progressive.

"We at G25 are impressed and attracted by the statements and messages of the Prime Minister, who seems to be resolved to deal with the culture of corruption and

committed to strengthening governance.

"In fact, you can already see the transformation that has been launched, implemented and the improvements continuing as planned," he tells *Sinar Harian*.

Mohd Sheriff adds that the G25 also hopes that Budget 2023 can implement plans to strengthen the government's finances in addition to ensuring that the country's fiscal

position remains stable. Both factors are important for economic growth, he notes.

In addition, the government and the private sector need to work harder to achieve the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (the "blueprint for peace and prosperity for the planet").

"This will facilitate and attract high quality investors to boost the country's economy," he explains.
