

# MEETING SPARKS SPECULATION

Pix of Anwar with Nik Aziz's sons have many wondering if Nik Abduh will join PH

**P**RIME Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's visit to Kelantan on Friday has sparked a flurry of questions following the revelation that he had met former Bachok member of parliament Nik Mohamad Abduh Nik Abdul Aziz.

The meeting, believed to be at Hotel Perdana here, was also attended by Nik Mohamad Abduh's elder brother, Nik Omar, as well as Anwar's wife, Datuk Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail.

News of the meeting made waves when two pictures of the meet were shared by preacher Wan Ji Wan Hussin, who was present.

Nik Mohamad Abduh and Nik Omar, sons of the late Pas spiritual leader Datuk Nik Abdul Aziz Nik Mat, have very different po-

litical leanings and have taken different political routes.

In the 15th General Election (GE15), Pas dropped Nik Mohamad Abduh as a candidate.

The Bachok seat that he used to contest was given to Muhamad Syahir Che Sulaiman.

Nik Omar had chosen to make

his political debut with Pakatan Harapan (PH) by contesting the Pasir Salak parliamentary seat.

Speculation is mounting over the possibility of Nik Mohamad Abduh joining PH after Pas dropped him in GE15.

Wan Ji, in sharing pictures from the meeting on social media,

wrote: "InsyaAllah, the legacy of Tok Guru Nik Abdul Aziz will always remain in the prime minister's heart."

In another social media post, Wan Ji said while many had sought to stamp out Nik Aziz's legacy, others were more than willing to continue it.
