



Jealous quarters want to break up unity govt, says Anwar

BENTONG: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said some parties are uneasy and want to break up the unity government because they are jealous of the coalition's strength,

Anwar, who is also Pakatan Harapan (PH) chairman, said this is because the cooperation involving PH with Barisan Nasional (BN), Gabungan Rakyat Sabah and Gabungan Parti Sarawak is a solid coalition.

"Why must they break us up? It's because they are jealous, and how long has it been (in this country) that we haven't had that kind of strength? So, there are efforts to break this coalition.

"But the important thing is that this unity government is stable. For what? For us to raise the economy. For what? To bring in foreign investment For what? For us to defend the fate of the people. Even investors have confidence in the unity government, so don't destroy or

damage it. If you want to create trouble, wait four more years."

Anwar was speaking at the *Ceramah Mega Perpaduan Madani* at Dataran Simpang Pelangai on Monday night, in conjunction with the Pelangai state by-election.

He pointed out that the spirit of togetherness in the unity government not only succeeded in providing political stability but also produced a clear policy for the development of the country, Bernama reported.

He also said the nine months of government brought benefits such as the Madani economic policy, National Energy Transition Roadmap, New Industrial Master Plan 2030 and the tabling of the mid-term review of the 12th Malaysia Plan.
