'INTERIM REPORT ON PAY REVIEW HANDED TO PM'

It was submitted after SSPA Review Main Committee meeting, says PSD

THE first interim report on the review of the public service remuneration system (SSPA) has been submitted to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, said the Public Service Department.

The department, in a Facebook post on Friday, stated that the report was submitted to Anwar by Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Mohd Zuki Ali and PSD director-general Datuk Seri Wan Ahmad Dahlan Abdul Aziz after the SSPA Review Main Committee meeting on Friday,

which was chaired by the prime minister.

The department said the meeting focused on initiatives that could contribute towards increasing civil servants' income.

The prime minister, during the tabling of the 2024 Budget in Parliament on Oct 13 last year, an-

nounced that the full implementation of the SSPA would begin in 2025.

He said a study on SSPA would be carried out comprehensively, focusing on increasing the productivity and efficiency of public services.

The SSPA study, which also fo-

cused on salary increases and allowances in the public sector, was expected to take almost two years.

The initiative is part of reforms of the public service, in line with the government's aspirations of developing Malaysia Madani. Bernama
