

# No consensus yet on fixed term Act: Anwar

**SERDANG:** Unity government leaders have not reached a consensus on a suggestion to enact a fixed term Parliament Act, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

Anwar, who is also finance minister, said the enactment of the law is not a priority for the government at the moment.

"I look forward to a discussion about it but at the same time, it is a little too premature for us to decide anything. We haven't even had any comments from the attorney-general," Anwar said after the launch of the "Al Untuk Rakyat" programme yesterday.

He was responding to Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi's call for a fixed-term Parliament so that a government would last until the end of its term or until the next general election is held.

Anwar added that the problem at present is the Opposition attempting to topple the government.

"They are very weak now and they don't even have one-third of the seats in Parliament, so why do we need to question this?"

"My focus, my priority now is to carry out transformation, to transform this country in terms of good governance, to be an anti-corruption nation." - Bernama
