King, queen get federal honours

KUALA LUMPUR: His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim, King of Malaysia, was yesterday conferred the Darjah Yang Maha Utama Kerabat Diraja Malaysia (DKM) by the government.

DKM, which translates to Most Excellent Order of the Royal Family of Malaysia, is a federal award conferred on the ruler appointed the Yang di-Pertuan Agong of Malaysia.

The conferment of the title on His Majesty was done by Prime

Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim at a ceremony in Istana Negara here.

Her Majesty Raja Zarith Sofiah, Queen of Malaysia, was conferred the Darjah Utama Seri Mahkota Negara (DMN), or The Most Exalted Order of the Crown of the Realm.

Present at the ceremony were Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof, Chief Justice

Tun Tengku Maimun Tuan Mat and Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Mohd Zuki Ali.
