

PM urges members to aid probe

KUALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim has urged Global Ikhwan Services and Business (GISB) Holdings Sdn Bhd members and supporters who are not under investigation to contact the authorities.

“We urge members and supporters, both locally and abroad, who are not under investigation to contact the authorities to resolve any issues they may be facing. The government continues to ensure that police investigations related to the company’s activities are being conducted transparently,” he said.

Anwar said this included ensuring that 542 children aged under 18, placed at the temporary protection centres, were given access to welfare, counselling, spiritual guidance and education for a certain period until investigations by the police, the state Islamic religious departments and councils; and the Welfare Department were completed.

Police have received 10 reports of forced labour exploitation involving GISB. The victims, aged between 14 and their early 20s, came forward after a public appeal. GISB has denied the allegations
