

'Govt will fix policy weaknesses'

PUTRAJAYA: The government is ready to address shortcomings in its policies, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

He said the Madani government was committed to listening to the people and improving policies and initiatives.

"If there are weaknesses, we will address them.

"I am not saying everything we have done so far is perfect, but we always listen to the people and adjust where necessary," he said after PKR's Seminar Pemantapan Organisasi dan Jelajah Presiden here yesterday.

Anwar was asked about Saturday's Pas-led rally in Kuala Lumpur, which was held despite the government introducing several economic and social initiatives.

He said such gatherings were allowed in a democratic country, but added that it was important to distinguish between genuine criticism and politically motivated misinformation.

"During the rally, it was claimed that fuel prices had gone up, when, in fact, they had gone down.

"There were also claims that salt prices had increased, among other things.

"This shows that what is being pushed is not fact-based but driven by political hatred. We urge the public to evaluate based on facts, not sentiment."

Anwar said the opposition made no serious proposals during the protest.

"There were only calls for Anwar to step down," he said.
