Anwar reminds Muslims to 'reflect sincerely on the Quran'

KUALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim has urged Muslims to continue reflecting sincerely on the Quran and seek Allah's forgiveness as Ramadan reaches the midpoint.

"*Alhamdulillah*, on this blessed day, we are given the opportunity to come together to commemorate the significant event of Nuzul Al-Quran, when the first revelation was sent down to Prophet Muhammad in the Cave of Hira.

"The first revelation, *Iqra* (read), marked the beginning of an era of knowledge, becoming a guiding light to uplift human dignity through justice and compassion.

"I would like to take this opportunity to remind myself and all

Muslims with a message of *taqwa*, to continue reflecting on the Quran with sincerity and to seek Allah's forgiveness this Ramadan.

"May we be among those chosen to witness Lailatul Qadr, a night that is better than a thousand months," he said in a Facebook post.

Quoting Surah Al-Baqarah, verse 185, Anwar emphasised that the Quran serves as a guide and source of light for those with *taqwa*, and that only those who observe Ramadan with faith and hope will truly experience its essence.
