# Questioning paused for Ismail Sabri to get papers

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Former prime minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri needs to obtain several documents before his statement recording can resume.

Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) Chief Commissioner Tan Sri Azam Baki told the *New Straits Times* that the documents on his assets had to be obtained from various financial institutions.

"These documents pertain to his assets and need to be obtained from various financial in-

stitutions," Azam said.

Earlier yesterday, Ismail Sabri left the MACC headquarters at 3.05pm, after being questioned for about five hours.

Asked if he would be questioned today, Ismail Sabri replied with "Selamat Hari Raya".

Yesterday was the sixth day of questioning for Ismail Sabri.

MACC said the Bera member of parliament was a suspect in an investigation into alleged money laundering and corruption when

he was in power.

So far, four of Ismail Sabri ex-aides and a money changer have been arrested.

MACC has also seized RM170 million in various foreign currencies, and 16kg of gold bullion valued at RM7 million.

The commission has also frozen 13 bank accounts containing over RM2 million.

Graft investigators have said the money changer was believed to have been involved in obtaining the foreign currencies.
