# PM pleased with ample supply of goods

**SUBANG JAYA:** Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim has expressed his satisfaction that there are no shortages of essential goods or significant price hikes for controlled items in the lead-up to Hari Raya Aidilfitri.

The prime minister attributed this success to the strong cooperation between key ministries and retailers, ensuring adequate supplies at fair prices.

"I have been in government since the 1980s. In the 1990s, I chaired the Cabinet Committee on Price Control ahead of major celebrations such as Hari Raya and Chinese New Year.

"This year, thanks to the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry, the Agriculture Ministry, and companies like Mydin, for the first time in my memory, prices have remained stable, and there is no shortage of goods in the lead-up to Aidilfitri or other major celebrations," he said.

Anwar made these remarks after launching the Price Reduction Campaign and Malaysia Madani logo placement at Mydin Supermarket here yesterday.

Present were Mydin managing director Datuk Ameer Ali Mydin, Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mo-

hd Ali and Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari.

Earlier, Anwar, who is also finance minister, inspected several controlled goods at the supermarket, including chicken, eggs and vegetables.

Previously, Anwar had instructed Armizan's ministry to ensure strict compliance with the Festive Season Maximum Price Scheme for Hari Raya, which runs until April 7.

Anwar also directed the ministry to work closely with the Agriculture and Food Security Ministry to enhance monitoring and enforcement.
