

'NO DEVELOPMENT SO FAR'

MACC widens probe into Dr M's assets to Switzerland

CYBERJAYA: The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission has expanded its investigation into the overseas assets of former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad to a few more countries, including Switzerland.

Chief Commissioner Tan Sri Azam Baki confirmed the move when asked about progress of the probe, which previously focused on the United Kingdom.

He said the agency was actively working with foreign authorities, including the International Anti-

Corruption Coordination Centre (IACCC) in the UK.

“(IACCC) is among the UK authorities assisting us on whether there are any assets involving Dr Mahathir.

“Yes, apart from the UK, we are also looking at other countries such as Switzerland. (However), there has been no development so far,” he said.

On Sept 11, Dr Mahathir had denied owning any assets in the UK. He had said he was “amazed” when he read a statement by Azam.
