

DPP's Office Receives IPs On Illegal Rally

KUALA LUMPUR, July 28 (Bernama) -- The Kuala Lumpur deputy public prosecutor's office today confirmed receiving investigation papers (IPs) from the police, in relation to the July 9 illegal rally held in the city centre and its surrounding areas.

Head of prosecution, Deputy Public Prosecutor Raja Rozela Raja Toran, said her office received the IPs in stages, from the city police contingent headquarters.

"Some of the IPs were returned to the police for further investigations while the rest are being studied before it could be referred to the Attorney-General's office for further directive," she told Bernama when contacted.

She declined comment on whether the prosecution intended to apply for warrants of arrest, especially against the illegal rally organisers, for violating the police restriction order against 91 individuals from entering the city central business district on July 9.

"It's a normal process and we have to make sure all IPs are in order. For the time being, it's too early to say whether anyone will be produced in court," said Raja Rozela.

During the rally, nearly 1,600 people were rounded up by the police, including Bersih chief Datuk S. Ambiga, Umno Youth chief Khairy Jamaluddin and PAS president Datuk Seri Abdul Hadi Awang.

However, they were released by 9, that night, after their statements were recorded.
