

In Pahang, a balanced Budget after 10 years of deficits

KUANTAN, Dec 5 — After a decade of red ink, the Pahang state government today finally put forth a Budget that leaves something left over for a rainy day.

Tabling a Budget that proposes to spend RM489.74 million against a revenue forecast of RM509.93 million for a projected surplus of RM68.25 million, Pahang Mentri Besar Adnan Yaakob said his administration will continue pursuing cost saving measures.

“But we will not sacrifice the quality of government services to the people in line with the ‘People First, Performance Now’ concept,” he was reported as saying by Bernama Online today.

“The state government has no plans to raise land premium and other taxes that would burden the people and will continue to manage expenses in the best interest of the people,” he added.
