

**No one is immune in NFC case, say MACC**

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 23 — The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) plan to call on all individuals linked to the National Feedlot Corporation (NFC) case so long as they are able to facilitate investigations, Bernama Online quoted director of investigations, Datuk Mustafar Ali, as saying today.

This would include the company's senior management, he added.

Mustafar is currently heading the special team tasked with investigating allegations of financial impropriety in the NFC.

The NFC runs the National Feedlot Centre in Gemas, which has been at the centre of a storm of controversy ever since the Auditor-General highlighted the publicly funded cattle-raising project as "a mess" in his report this year.

The NFC is headed by Datuk Seri Dr Mohamed Salleh Ismail, husband to Women, Family and Community Minister and Wanita Umno chief, Datuk Seri Shahrizat Jalil. Their children are also directors in the company.

MACC officers raided the NFC office in Solaris Mont Kiara today where they seized documents and a desktop PC.

Mustafar also told the news portal that the businessman, who was arrested yesterday for allegedly attempting to bribe several senior CCID officers involved in the case, was now with the MACC.

He said the MACC were still in the midst of determining his involvement in the NFC if at all.

Deputy IGP Datuk Seri Khalid Abu Bakar said, meanwhile, that the 45-year-old man is also suspected of several other attempts to bribe the police.

He, however, refused to divulge further details on the grounds that investigations are still ongoing.
