

**No Irregularity Detected So Far In Probe Into NFC Funds Issue - Deputy IGP

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 1 (Bernama) -- Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Seri Khalid Abu Bakar said today police investigations have so far not detected any breach of trust or irregularity in the handling of funds by the National Feedlot Centre (NFC) and its purchase of a luxury condominium in the city.

He said the investigation was going on and gave the assurance that the process would be conducted with transparency without protecting anyone.

"The police investigation so far shows no element of breach of trust. However, we are still carrying out the investigation, including on how the NFC funds have been spent.

"We have called up 74 individuals to record their statements," he told reporters after launching the joint patrol by the police and army under the National Blue Wave Strategy at Taman Bukit Rahman Putra, here.

Also present were Chief of Army Gen Datuk Zulkifli Zainal Abidin, Malaysian Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF) executive council member Tan Sri Robert Phang and Police Director of Internal Security and Public Order Datuk Salleh Md Rashid.

On another matter, Khalid said investigation was ongoing into the detention of 13 individuals, among them Philippine and Indonesian nationals, in Tawau, Sabah, recently on suspicion of attempting to revive militant activities in the state.

"The investigation demands time to obtain information on the activities and their network.

"We have solid evidence to detain them under the Internal Security Act as it involves the question of security of the country and people," he said.
