

Najib: Commissioner for human rights proposal still alive, discussions to continue

PERTH, Oct 29 — Datuk Seri Najib Razak told reporters that recommendation proposed by the Eminent Persons Group (EPG) on the formation of the Commissioner for Human Rights will be referred to the Commonwealth Secretary General and Ministerial Action Group (CMAG) a Bernama report stated today.

The Prime Minister (picture) who in Perth to attend the CHOGM meeting said that the differing views by the heads of states will not affect the commitment to improve processes on matters relating to principle rules of law, human rights and democracy.

The Prime Minister added that the heads of states will explore all options to reach a consensus on human rights issues and democracy.

The Prime Minister reinforced the importance of the CHOGM meeting stressing that the aim was to make the meeting relevant and adaptive. The Prime Minister also explained that the EPG was constituted and have accepted the Commonwealth Charter.
