

Mubarak Studying How It Can Help BN In GE

MEDAN, Sept 17 (Bernama) -- The Council of Former Elected Representatives (MUBARAK) is carrying out a study on how it can the Barisan Nasional (BN) in facing the upcoming 13th general election.

Its president Datuk Seri Abdul Aziz Abdul Rahman said Mubarak's role and contribution must fit its position as it was not a political body but only a non-governmental organisation (NGO).

In this context, he said, Mubarak planned to foster closer ties with other NGOs.

"What we have is political experience which we gathered when we were politically active. We are look at working together with other NGOs made up of ex-policeman, soldiers, trishaw, taxi and sundry shop operators to together help the BN in facing the next GE," he told reporters here last night.
