

**Conman 'Tengku Razali' Arrested By Police

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 23 (Bernama) -- An unemployed man who impersonated an Istana Negara employee called 'Tengku Razali' has been arrested by police.

Brickfields police chief ACP Wan Abdul Bari Wan Abdul Khalid said the suspect is believed active impersonating civil servants in the Klang Valley.

'Tengku Razali', 28, was arrested on Aug 18 in Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman here about 2pm.

He said the suspect had impersonated a lawyer at Istana Negara to cheat his victims.

One of his victims was a 44 year-old kuih seller in Taman Wahyu who was told that she would be given tender to supply kuih to Istana Negara.

"The suspect took the victim to the front entrance of Istana Negara and ordered her to remove jewellery as it could not be taken into the palace.

"He then took the jewellery and said he wanted to park the car leaving the woman stranded," Wan Abdul Bari told a press conference here today.

The suspect is believed to be involved in over 45 cases of impersonating and cheating cases with total losses estimated at RM200,000.

The suspect from Batu Pahat, Johor was active since 2006 and has seven criminal records.

Wan Abdul Bari said following his arrest, police arrested three men for allegedly buying goods from the suspect.

Remand for all four had been extended to next week to assist investigation under Section 379, 392 and 420 of Penal Code.
