

Home Ministry mulls action against PKR Wantia chief over 6P allegations

KUALA LUMPUR: The Home Ministry is considering what action to take against Wanita Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) head Zuraida Kamaruddin following the allegations she hurled about the ministry's 6P programme to register immigrants.

Home Ministry secretary-general Tan Sri Mahmood Adam said so far no police report had been made about pledges that had to be made by illegal immigrants when registering for the programme.

He said the actions being considered were filing a police report against her, reporting the matter to the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission or filing a suit.

"The ministry does not rule out taking all three," he said in a statement here Monday, Aug 22.

Zuraida last week had claimed that a PKR probe about the programme had found that illegal immigrants were made to take an oath of allegiance to Umno and the Barisan Nasional to be considered for registration.

The programme was introduced to register legal and illegal immigrants using the bio-metric system whereby amnesty will be offered to illegal immigrants prior to their legalisation as immigrants or deportation. - Bernama
