

**Tariff For Use Of National Single Window Reduced By Nine Per Cent**

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 26 (Bernama) -- The tariff imposed on the use of Malaysia's National Single Window (NSW) has been reduced by nine per cent from 0.88 sen to 0.80 sen per kilobyte for all private users in line with the agreement inked between Dagang Net Technologies Sdn Nhd and the Malaysian government.

The reduction came into force yesterday.

The tariff was first introduced at RM1.20 per kilobyte in 1994 and was later revised to 0.88 sen per kilobyte in 2009.

Dagang Net chief executive officer Zulina Mohammed Salleh said: "We are confident these collaborative efforts can help render a positive impact on the volume of national trade as the costs of conducting business is now lowered, allowing our trading communities to unleash their full potential at the forefront of international trade."

The tariff reduction would also improve the small and medium enterprises' capabilities to export as it has been always challenging for them to expand their businesses into global export markets, she said in a statement.

The robust NSW for trade facilitation is an electronic system that enables submission of data and information securely and efficiently via one Single Window to speed up customs clearance, reduce time and costs.

Set up in 1989, Dagang Net is Malaysia's first and largest e-commerce organisation that pioneered and spearheaded trade initiatives to create a paperless electronic customs-related service to ease international trading processes for import-export, trading and logistics industries.
