

**No Pressure To Quit - Koh**

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 13 (Bernama) -- Gerakan president Tan Sri Dr Koh Tsu Koon today reiterated that he is under no pressure to quit leading the party.

He said grassroots members had given him undivided support as party president even though he had just held the post for one term.

"I will lead the party as usual to achieve party objectives with other component parties in the Barisan Nasional for a united community as envisaged in the 1Malaysia concept introduced by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak," he told reporters at the Gerakan's head office here today.

Koh said the 1Malaysia concept was a policy Gerakan had been fighting for since it was set up in 1968.

Meanwhile, Dr Koh said the party's National Delegates Conference this Sunday themed 'Moving with the People' would focus on the economy, politics, education as well as the party's preparation for the coming 13th general election.

Earlier, Dr Koh presented cheques to four private Chinese schools located around Kuala Lumpur to assist them improve school infrastructure and learning facilities.

The four schools, Kuen Cheng High School, Chong Hwa Confucian Independence School, Tsun Jin High School and Confucian Middle School received RM250,000 each.
