

**Single mum, PKR politician freed over 'Datuk' bribe case**

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 2 — A single mother, together with a politician, was acquitted over a RM50,000 bribe to gain a "Datuk" award.

Rantau Panjang PKR chief Mohammad Agos Mohd Noor (picture), 52, and Nor Azimah Jamaludin, 31, were freed by Judge Rosbiahainin Ariffin without calling for their defence, Bernama Online reported.

Nor Azimah was accused of accepting a cheque dated December 7, 2011 as a bribe from Izuldin Hani Mohd Noor at a Taman Melati restaurant here on December 8.

She was also charged with deceiving Izuldin Hani, that she could help secure a "Datuk" award from the Persatuan Kerabat Diraja Duli Yang Maha Mulia Long Yunus Negeri Kelantan, contrary to Kelantan's constitution.

The charges were made under the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) Act.

Mohammad Agos was charged with abetting Nor Azimah.

The trial saw 22 witnesses testify.
