

Public Urged To Attend Select Committee Hearing On Electoral Reform

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 10 (Bernama) - The public has been urged to attend hearing of the Parliamentary Select Committee (PSC) on Electoral Reform once the session begins this week.

Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Seri Nazri Aziz said he has discussed with PSC chairman Datuk Dr Maximus Ongkili that it will hear all feedback without exception.

"I hope the public will give their views as they will be taken into account by PSC," he told reporters after opening Bangkok Sticky Fingers Restaurant and Bistro here Wednesday night.

PSC has lined-up six public hearing sessions nationwide to get feedback before making recommendations. Asked if PSC was made a platform to attack the government, Nazri said the public could give views freely as it comprises members of parliament from the opposition.

"No problem as this committee consists of opposition members and not owned by Barisan Nasional (BN)," he added.

PSC comprises five BN representatives, three opposition representatives and an independent representative.

They are Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi (PBB-Kapit), Datuk Seri Mohd Radzi Sheikh Ahmad (BN-Kangar), Tan Sri Dr Fong Chan Onn (BN-Alor Gajah) P. Kamalanathan (BN-Hulu Selangor, Azmin Ali (PKR-Gombak), Anthony Loke (DAP-Rasah), Dr Hatta Ramli (PAS-Kuala Krai) and Wee Choo Keong (Independent-Wangsa Maju).
