

**Capability, Voters' Support More Important Than Level Of Health, Says Md Isa

KANGAR, Nov 19 (Bernama) -- A candidate's ability to win in the general election should take precedence over their level of health, Perlis Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Dr Md Isa Sabu said today.

He remarked that although a candidate's state of health could be considered as a criterion for selection, it was more important for them to have the capability and voters' support.

He made the remark while closing the Kangar-level national intellectuals' discourse known as Winner titled 'Parliamentary Select Committee (PSC): The Government's Earnest Effort To Have Transparent General Election' at the Perlis National Culture and Arts Department's auditorium, here.

Md Isa emphasised that a candidate who had health problems but was still able to serve well should not be sidelined.

The panellists at the discourse organised by the Perlis Special Affairs Department were Kangar Member of Parliament Datuk Seri Mohd Radzi Sheikh Ahmad, Election Commission Academy training officer Abdul Halim Abdul Rahman and Universiti Utara Malaysia dean of Student Development and Alumni, Assoc Prof Dr Ahmad Murtadha Mohamed.

On the discourse, Mohd Radzi who is also PSC deputy chairman, said it touched on various issues including the health of an election candidate and voters residing abroad.
