

**BN Concerned About Welfare Of Indian Community**

BANTING, Nov 20 (Bernama) -- MIC leaders at the grassroots level need to continuously disseminate information to the Indian community on the efforts of the Barisan Nasional (BN) in assisting them.

MIC deputy president Datuk Seri Dr S.Subramaniam said if leaders in MIC were to keep quiet, the people especially the Indian community would not be aware of the efforts carried out by BN in helping to raise their position and living standard.

Many were not aware that the BN government's allocation for Tamil primary schools since 2008 to date had exceeded RM230 million which was the largest allocation ever received by an educational institution," he said at the 'Friendship with Indian Youths' session organised by the MIC Kuala Langat Youth, here Sunday night.

He said under the 2012 Budget, the BN government had allocated RM2.4 billion to provide schooling aid of RM100 each to every student in primary and secondary schools while families with household income of less than RM3,000 would receive RM500 assistance.

Apart from that BN especially MIC had resolved many citizenship and identity card issues among the Indian community, he said.
