The 40-year-old mother of six, who has to support her family, including her husband who is suffering from a skin condition, had more reason to celebrate as her dilapidated house, left behind by her father, was restored within three days thanks to the Special Affairs Department of the Information, Communications and Culture Ministry, and volunteers from the Jelebu parliamentary constituency's Tenaga Muda Penggerak Masyarakat.

"I am touched by the assistance given. I am also happy to have been able to meet the prime minister," she said at her house in Padang Ibu near here yesterday.

Najib, who was in town for the national-level Hari Raya open house at SMK Guar Perahu, sampled her fried mushrooms and chatted with her.

Nor Azmah said Najib was friendly, humorous and a leader with the people's interests at heart.

Saodah Abdul Rahman, 60, and her mother, Che Siah Bakar, 88, will also remember this year's Hari Raya celebrations with fondness.

The two, from Kampung Padang Ibu, received a visit from Datin Seri Masnah Rais, the wife of Information, Communications and Culture Minister Datuk Seri Dr Rais Yatim.

She spent an hour at the house and handed over donations to the two and their neighbours, Che Salasiah Ismail, 60, Jamaliah Abdullah, 74, and Ropeah Osman, 74.

During the visit, Saodah, who is suffering from heart ailment, diabetes and hypertension, told Masnah of her wish for her mother's dilapidated house be repaired.

Masnah said she had conveyed her wish to the Permatang Pauh Umno division and hoped the repairs would be carried out as soon as possible.
