

More Speak Out Against Jan 9 Illegal Assembly

KUALA LUMPUR, Jan 4 (Bernama) -- The Cheras Umno Division has questioned the silence of the Bar Council and the Malaysian Human Rights Commission (Suhakam) on the adamancy of the opposition to hold an illegal assembly on Jan 9.

The division chief, Datuk Wira Syed Ali Al-Habshee claimed that the attitude of the two bodies clearly showed them as conspiring with Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim to use street demonstrations to clear himself of the sodomy charge.

"As a legal practitioner, I would like to ask them (Bar Council and Anwar's counsels) whether the action of the pro-Anwar groups are correct and reasonable.

"If they are just only interested in being tools of the opposition, it would be better for both of them to be dissolved," he said in his latest entry on Umnocheras.blogspot.com today.

The court is scheduled to make a decision on the opposition leader who was accused of sodomising his former aide, Mohd Saiful Bukhari Azlan on Jan 9.

Syed Ali demanded that the Home Affairs Ministry (KDN) take legal action against the Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) leader for attempting to organise illegal assembly on Jan 9.

Meanwhile in Kuching, Sarawak Barisan Nasional Youth head, Datuk Fadillah Yusof challenged leaders in the PKR to cancel the 'Free Anwar 901' campaign if they really want to uphold the legal and justice systems in the country.

He said the claim by PKR Sarawak vice-chairman See Chee How who said the campaign was not a personal agenda but to support the political policy of Anwar was a deception to confuse opposition party members and the public.

"The action to free Anwar is a political move to rouse the anger of the people as if Anwar was set up under our legal system when he had been given ample opportunities to defend himself," Fadillah, who is the Deputy Minister of Science, Technology and Innovation, told Bernama here.

Meanwhile the Kuantan and Paya Besar Umno Youth Divisions, made police reports to protest against the 'Free Anwar 901' assembly planned for Jan 9 at the Kuantan Police Headquarters today.

Kuantan Umno Youth vice-head, Hazrin Basri said there were 13 police reports made against the planned assembly by several non-government organisations and individuals.

"There is no need to hold such an assembly as all parties would suffer," he told reporters here today.

Meanwhile in Raub, Umno Division chief Datuk Shahiruddin Ab Moin urged the people in the district not to participate in the assembly.

He said the assembly was not only illegal but it could spark public unrest which was against the culture of the people in the country.

Pahang Umno Youth chief Abu Jimi Samat hoped no youths in the state would participate in the assembly.

Abu Jimi, who is also the Lipis Umno Division Youth chief, said the assembly was illegal and would smear the good image of the country.

Meanwhile in Kuala Terengganu, Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Ahmad Said expressed his regrets that the illegal demonstration '901 Campaign' would be held in Kuala Lumpur on Jan 9.

He said the demonstration planned by supporters of Anwar was an attempt to create unrest as they did not believe in the legal and justice systems through the court.

"This is something that should not have happened and it is the trend of the opposition," he said after chairing the weekly Exco meeting here today.

"On this I am appealing to the people of Terengganu not to be involved in the street demonstrations in Kuala Lumpur on Monday," he said.
