

**PDRM Personnel Must Safeguard Discipline - Sultan Ibrahim

KUALA LUMPUR, Jan 7 (Bernama) - The Sultan of Johor, Sultan Ibrahim almarhum Sultan Iskandar, has urged Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) personnel to safeguard discipline to stop society from having negative perception of the force.

He said PDRM personnel must be careful as their action attract the attention of society which has been fed with negative things.

"Don't expect praise but be prepared to be scolded for making small mistakes as society only see bad things and not the good," he said at the passing out parade for probation inspectors at Police Training Centre (Pulapol) here.

The Sultan's son, Tunku Abdul Jalil, was among the 960 trainees who completed nine months training at Pulapol.

Sultan Ibrahim who is also Colonel-in-Chief of Special Forces said PDRM should also tackle rising cycercrime cases as they had incurred big losses.

"PDRM personnel must equip themselves with knowledge and skills in information communication technology as it is a working environment for the present generation with social media tools like Facebook and Twitter.

"With technology, they can share and disseminate information quickly, effectively and communicate directly with society," he said.
