

Muhyiddin: PM's apology for BN's mistakes shows humility

KUALA LUMPUR: The Prime Minister's apology over Barisan Nasional's losses in the last general election shows "humility and the awareness of weaknesses that needs to be rectified," said Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

He said steps to correct Barisan's deficiencies could be seen through the positive impact brought about via Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak's transformation programmes.

"What is said by the Prime Minister shows humility. As human beings, we have weaknesses. The government, under Barisan Nasional, we know, also has weaknesses, and possibly several mistakes.

"Generally, during the 54-year period, no one can deny the fact, despite the weaknesses, we have made huge progress in the fields of socio-economy, culture, education, international relations and various others," he told reporters after opening the 2012 World Kidney Day at Dataran Merdeka, here today.

Najib extended an apology to the people for mistakes that led voters to reject Barisan in 2008.

"We have learnt from the mistakes and we are sorry.

"The winners are sorry ... and the losers, too, are sorry," he said during a one-day visit to Kedah on Saturday.
