

Ambiga may get high post in Pas

KUALA LUMPUR: Talk that former Bar Council president and Bersih 2.0 chairman Datuk Ambiga Sreenevasan would be the first non-Muslim to hold a high position in Pas is "not totally baseless".

Anuar Shaari, the former private secretary to Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, said there could be some truth in the talk as Pas deputy president Mohamad Sabu and Anwar supporters in Pas enjoyed close relations with Ambiga.

"Mohamad and Anwar are close to Ambiga and their relationship would perhaps contribute to Ambiga being given a high post in Pas," said Anuar when contacted yesterday.

Pas supreme council member Dr Dzulkefly Ahmad had recently said that Pas would be willing to accept a non-Muslim as its vice-president in the future.

Dzulkefly said the move would be subject to approval by the party leadership, especially the ulama faction, and had yet to be mooted in the supreme council.
