

Two NGOs lodge reports against PKR

PETALING JAYA: Perkasa yesterday urged police to investigate allegations that Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) was collaborating with two Jewish-linked organisations in its quest to unseat Barisan Nasional (BN) in the general election.

Perkasa Petaling Perdana district chairman Abd Hadi Mat Jani lodged a report at the district police headquarters here yesterday afternoon, accompanied by 30 members and residents from the Lembah Subang residents' association.

The group was reacting to a statement by Selangor Umno secretary Datuk Seri Mohd Zin Mohamed on March 14 that PKR de facto leader Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim had obtained a book on unethical tactics, written by a branch of the United States-based National Endowment For Democracy (NED), for the purpose of winning the elections.

NED is a non-profit foundation dedicated to the growth of democratic institutions worldwide. Zin had also alleged that a think tank, the Konrad-Adenauer Foundation (KAF), had sponsored PKR leaders to attend political courses in Germany.

KAF is a body that helps non-conservative Jewish groups and was believed to be funded by NED.

"Our values are different from theirs. Based on our research on KAF and NED, they could spark hatred among Malaysians," said Hadi.

Meanwhile, Gabungan Pertubuhan Bukan Kerajaan Selangor dan Wilayah Persekutuan (Gabukas) also lodged a report at the Ampang Jaya police headquarters yesterday.

Gabukas chairman Datuk Mad Aris Mad Yusuf said that if the allegation was true, then it would be a direct threat to Islam and Muslims here.
