

PM: Cabinet to study PSC's recommendations on polls (Update)

PHNOM PENH: The Cabinet and Election Commission will study the 22 recommendations of the Parliamentary Select Committee on Electoral Reform, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

He said the government has nothing to hide as it too wanted a clean and fair election.

He said PSC chairman Datuk Seri Dr Maximus Ongkili would be asked to table the report in Cabinet soon.

Najib was speaking to reporters on the sidelines of the Asean Summit here Wednesday.

In KUALA LUMPUR: Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Seri Mohamed Nazri Abdul Aziz said the PSC would discuss the PSC's proposal to set up another body to oversee the implementation of its proposals.

On a separate issue, Nazri said it would not be feasible for organisers of the proposed Bersih 3.0 on April 28 to have their gathering at Dataran Merdeka.

"Dataran Merdeka is not a gazetted area for public gatherings," he said when asked to comment on the proposed gathering later this month.

On Wednesday, the Bersih 2.0 committee announced that it would hold a rally to push for electoral reforms.

The recently Peaceful Assembly Act 2011 allows for public gathering only in specific areas.
